

Mourmelon le Grand - July the 29th 1941

Dear Albert,

Your last letter is arrived the day before yesterday. We are now going to do the things in that order:

- 1.) A ~~few~~ days before you arrive, we'll write down the furniture's list. I'll assist this formality.
- 2.) You'll append your signature to the lease-act when you'll arrive in France. But. I must tell you that now - it will be written you rent the house for 2500 francs per month and you'll have to give the proprietor - from hand to hand, as we say in France. — 2500×12 : 30.000 francs, before to sign the act. That because the proprietor has to pay a 18% tax on the sum which figures on the act. In that case he'll have to pay only the half he would have if it was written 5000 per month on the lease. So you'll have to come in Mourmelon with enough of french money.

For the rest, all is well. I suppose when you'll be arrived in France you'll send us a letter, or a card, or a telegram. Now I leave for to day. Good bye. My best regards to all the family
